1 person- Disaster Quick Kit: \$15.00

Emergency blanket, poncho, food bar, whistle, water, light stick, body warmer, mini first aid kit, dust mask. Great for cars, travelers, students and commuters.

1 person-3 day disaster kit

3 ACTIONS FOR EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

In today's climate, it's more important than ever that all of us be prepared for possible emergencies. Natural or other disasters can strike suddenly, at any time and where. But there are three actions everyone can take that can help make them better prepared.



Make a Plan: Planning ahead is the first step to a calmer and more assured disaster response. Discuss with your family the disasters that can happen where you live. Establish responsibilities for each member of your household and plan to work together as a team. Review and update your plan at least once a year.



Get a Kit: What you have on hand when a disaster happens can make a big difference. Have at least three days of supplies in an easy-to-carry evacuation kit, with additional supplies on hand. Remember to check your kit and replace any expired items every six months. Don't forget to get a disaster kit for your pets.



Be Informed: Learn what disasters or emergencies may occur where you live, work and play. These events can vary from those affecting only you and your family, like a home fire or medical emergency, to those affecting the entire community like a flood or hurricane. Identify how local authorities will notify you during an emergency and how you will get important information.

Join other members of your community through the American Red Cross in taking these first steps. You never know how many people your actions will affect, how many lives you might change. When we come together we become part of something bigger than us all.
